



## Pharmacy POCT implementation checklist

<input type="checkbox"/>	<b>Review local laws and regulations:</b> check with your state's state board of pharmacy. If legislation does not allow for testing/treating, appeal to the State Pharmacy Association to present test and treat to the state Legislature for pharmacists to test and prescribe.
<input type="checkbox"/>	<b>Develop a business case/marketing plan:</b> contact QuidelOrtho for assistance with developing a business case and share marketing ideas.
<input type="checkbox"/>	<b>Assess space:</b> determine where you can allocate space for point-of-care consultations and testing.
<input type="checkbox"/>	<b>Acquire a CLIA waiver:</b> a CLIA Waiver is required to perform testing. Apply for the CLIA Waiver by accessing the <a href="https://www.cms.gov">CMS.gov</a> website.
<input type="checkbox"/>	<b>Establish a protocol, logs and processes:</b> set up the program, from the protocol you follow to the process and documentation, based on the unique state requirements.
<input type="checkbox"/>	<b>Build a communication plan:</b> for follow-up with patients, the patients' healthcare providers (HCP) if available, and the collaborative practice agreement (CPA) provider.
<input type="checkbox"/>	<b>Determine state training requirements:</b> establish a training program that meets the state requirements. Consider recurring trainings in case of turnover.
