

Pharmacy POCT implementation checklist

Review local laws and regulations: check with your state's state board of pharmacy. If legislation does not allow for testing/treating, appeal to the State Pharmacy Association to present test and treat to the state Legislature for pharmacists to test and prescribe.
Develop a business case/marketing plan: contact QuidelOrtho for assistance with developing a business case and share marketing ideas.
Assess space: determine where you can allocate space for point-of-care consultations and testing.
Acquire a CLIA waiver: a CLIA Waiver is required to perform testing. Apply for the CLIA Waiver by accessing the <u>CMS.gov</u> website.
Establish a protocol, logs and processes: set up the program, from the protocol you follow to the process and documentation, based on the unique state requirements.
Build a communication plan: for follow-up with patients, the patients' healthcare providers (HCP) if available, and the collaborative practice agreement (CPA) provider.
Determine state training requirements: establish a training program that meets the state requirements. Consider recurring trainings in case of turnover.
